For a change, no glitches in online CAT

Bangalore: Students did not experience any inconvenience on Day 8 of the Common Admission Test, 2009, conducted across eight centres in Bangalore on Saturday. There were no reports of the hitches that are being reported the



past few days due to the malfunctioning software. This is the first time the exam is being held online.

However, the rumour mills were abuzz that a few of the centres were shut due to technical errors, causing panic among the candidates. Later, Prometric, which is conducting the test, allayed the fears stating: "With reference to rumours that the CAT has been cancelled at certain centres in Bangalore, Prometric would like to clarify that this is not true. Testing is proceeding in all centres across Bangalore as scheduled."
